


Tree Protection Ordinance Exercise Sample Site Plan

Exercise Scenario Description:

You are the City and have received a single family home owner's application to have trees removed in their yard due to various reasons described below. They would like to remove four trees (shaded in light green on the site plan to the right and the table below). They will leave the other trees on site alone.

Below are Tree Identification Numbers and a Tree Description that includes tree context factors and reasons why the home owner wants to remove the tree.

Tree I.D. Number:	Tree Description
①	18" White Oak that is part of a grove and the canopy extends over the neighbor's yard.
②	24" White Oak that is part of a grove and the canopy extends over the neighbor's yard. It is also in the way of a Proposed Children's Play Area that you would like to build.
③	18" White Oak located in the neighbor's yard. The tree is part of a grove and the canopy extends over your yard.
④	32" Maple that is located within a 75' Stream Buffer. It is casting too much shade on your Rose Garden.
⑤	14" Ailanthus (Invasive Species) in the side yard. It is in the way of your proposed driveway expansion project.
⑥	16" Oak located in public right-of-way, not yet impacting overhead power lines
⑦	36" Oak located in public right-of-way that will be impacting overhead power lines. It is ugly (but healthy) and is about to begin impacting overhead power lines.
⑧	18" Pine tree in the backyard.



CRZ - Critical Root Zone

Note: Trees are considered destroyed if more than 33% of the Critical Root Zone (CRZ) is impacted.
